SUMMARY

This past summer, I had the opportunity to work with MAS for the Masses. The mission of MAS for the Masses is to teach those in the community (primarily the Westside of San Antonio) about the history of Mexican Americans tied back to other cultures as well. This summer we decided to focus on the younger population by providing story time sessions with an activity following it called "Cafecitos y Libros," (held at Barrio Barista, a local coffee shop) of course it all relating to Mexican American culture. We did this to offer an opportunity for preschool and early elementary school children to be exposed to Mexican American culture. With these story time sessions, we enhanced bilingual vocabulary recognition. We provided inclusivity in both the story and activity; we built a community. One of our main purposes this summer, was to foster creativity among the children and caregivers through relevant craft projects. With this experience I aspired to really get out of my comfort zone, to be more confident, and make a small difference in the community I have grown up in.



During my time with MAS for the masses, I helped plan our "Cafecitos y Libros" sessions. I also designed some zines as take home activities for the kids each session. I assisted in making the *PowerPoints we would project in the sessions so* the kids could easily follow along with the book. During the sessions I read to the kids, interacted with them and facilitated the activities, such as making piñatas, playing loteria, & mini embossing activity.

I always strived to be kind and benevolent to those who I worked with. I strived to enforce inclusivity and made all the kids who attended our sessions feel a part of the community we formed. I really struggled with speaking in front of the kids at first, but with the support and encouraging words from those involved I was able to get out of my shell and read books to the children without a problem by our 2nd session.
