

Teaching at Aum School Melanie Narkunan, Biochemistry, May 2023

SUMMARY

Aum School is a nonprofit organization that provides quality education along with Indian culture and Vedic values. This past summer I received the opportunity to teach kids, aged two to twelve, various aspects of Indian culture. I spent about 8 hours a day implementing and teaching Hindu Vedic values such as eating healthy, home-cooked food on the floor, practicing yoga, reading stories from our ancient scriptures, and learning Indian classical dance. Apart from teaching those, the kids also learned different languages including Hindi and Sanskrit and Vedic math, Carnatic singing, and prayers. Working with kids has been a personal goal of mine since I'm interested in becoming a healthcare professional specifically for children.



As a teacher at the Aum School, I was required to lead and follow a schedule as well as create part of the curriculum specifically for dance, art, and story time. This position made it essential for me to exhibit my leadership skills.

This experience allowed me to display my equitability, resiliency, and benevolence. In order for the kids to get the best education, I must treat them equally and kindly at all times, even when the situation seem difficult.

LEARNING **OUTCOMES**

Some important skills I had to work on were patience and flexibility in terms of teaching the kids the same lesson in different ways so that everyone can understand and learn. Because most of the kids in my class were very young (2-5 years old) and there were about 15-20 of them, working efficiently and handling their behavior properly became extremely vital. I *learned how important positive* reinforcement and encouragement was to young kids.
