SUMMARY

During the Summer of 2019, I worked as an intern at Wisener Nunnally Roth, LLP. This is a small law firm that practices a variety of law. I interned with them for a total 6 weeks, during which I completed one long term project where I sorted closed files and reached out to clients. In addition to this, I worked on various legal documents covering multiple areas of law. I also had the opportunity to go to court with one of the lawyers over a custodial case. The goal of the internship was to gain real life knowledge and experience of what practicing law looks like daily, including the amount of preparation done for each case. I can say that within the six-week span of my internship I learned so much about the innerworkings of a law firm and of various aspects of the legal field.
